**BUSINESS, MARKETING, AND COMPUTER EDUCATION
TEACHER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM**

Program Description: The Business, Marketing, and Computer Education Teacher Certification Program prepares individuals to teach business, marketing and computer courses at the middle and senior high school levels. Upon completion of the program, students are awarded the Initial Teaching Certificate issued by the Illinois Teacher Certification Board. With this certificate, individuals will be qualified to teach courses in accounting, basic business, business law, computer concepts and applications, information processing, marketing, personal finance, etc. Graduates of this program may also choose to teach at a community or business college, or in industry. In addition to being certified to teach, program graduates will possess the skills needed to meet daily challenges presented by a technological business environment.

Participation in student and professional organizations develops leadership skills, improves communication skills, and provides networking and professional contacts. Students are encouraged to participate in organizations such as Phi Beta Lambda (the collegiate chapter of the Future Business Leaders of America), Pi Omega Pi (the honor society of business education), Southern Illinois Business Education Association, and Illinois Business Education Association. - Successful criminal background check;
- Successful completion of EDUC 210 or equivalent.
